## Instructions: Mini Greenhouse 6-Pot Herb



STEP 1

Place the growing medium pellet in a bowl. Add 3/4 cup lukewarm water. The pellet will expand as it absorbs water and turn into growing medium. Fluff the growing medium with a fork, adding more water if necessary.



STEP 2

Distribute 3/4 of the growing medium among the six pots, reserving the rest to cover the seeds.



STEP 3

Sprinkle approximately 5 seeds per pot evenly over the surface of the growing medium. You can either sow all the pots with one variety or you may use different seed varieties for each pot. Save the extra seeds for future plantings or plant in your garden.



STEP 4

Lightly cover the seeds with the remaining growing medium. Place pots in greenhouse.

## Care:



WATERING

Use a fine mist or gently sprinkle water on top to moisten. Water daily with a fine mist to keep moist. A spray bottle is a perfect tool to water your plants. Do not over water.



LIGHT

Place in a warm, sunny location. Close the lid of the greenhouse. For best results, turn the greenhouse often so all sides receive equal sunlight.



GERMINATION

Germination requires consistent temperature and moisture. Keep growing medium moist, but do not allow it to become soggy as this will cause the seeds to rot. Days to germination: Oregano 8-14; Thyme 20-30

TRANSPLANTING

Depending on how many plants you have been able to grow, you want to be sure to 'thin out' the plants to give them enough space to grow in the container. Leave the strongest, healthiest plant in each pot. Remove all others. It is best to snip the unwanted plants with a small pair of scissors at ground level. Attempting to pull out the extra seedlings may harm the root system of the seedling you want to keep. Once the remaining seedling reaches 3"-5" in height, transplant it to a bigger pot or to your garden (after danger of last frost has passed). To transplant, moisten and carefully remove the delicate plant taking special care not to damage the stem or roots while moving. A dinner fork is a great tool to assist you in removing the seedling.



FERTILIZER

It is important to feed your plants. Use a standard plant fertilizer when your seedlings are 2"-3" in height and follow the instructions on the fertilizer packaging.
